- A.** (1) **Primavera**, a 13-foot (4 meters) bronze sculpture installed in front of the new Fukuoka City Hall in Fukuoka, Japan.
- B.** (2) **Airborn** and (3) **Madre in Alto** were acquired by Yumeji Museum in Okayama, Japan.
- (4) **Paolo & Francesca**, 40 inches (1 meter) installed at Okayama Municipal Center in Okayama, Japan.
- C.** (5) **Caftan**, a 50-inch (1.3 meters) bronze sculpture installed in the Hakone Open-Air Museum in Kanagawa-ken, Japan.
- (6) **First Step**, (7) **Madre in Circolo**, and (8) **Madre in Alto** - a commission for "ESTE" Condominium's outdoor park in Mitsuura, Kanagawa-ken.
